EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR COMMENTS

The staff is here to provide all residents a safe and secure place to live. We have worked to improve security over the last 10 years by install a more secure entry system and cameras in all of the buildings. The job of security staff is to monitor the buildings life safety equipment and insure all emergencies are reported and appropriate authorities are notified. Recently, we have had an increase of requests for the security person to review cameras to see who knocked on the apartment door, who left a package at the door, who entered the apartment in the resident's absence. While these requests are investigated, these are not among the emergent duties of the staff member on duty. If the request is made and the security person is busy, it will be deferred until an appropriate time and may be investigated by a different staff member. All residents are reminded that Luther Towers and Luther Village staff are not law enforcement and should not be requested to perform those type of duties. We are receiving requests to prevent the entry of individuals (family members and others) while we usually have no ability to do so. Residents are responsible to insure they do not admit strangers or others into the building. If

you are concerned about someone coming to your apartment make sure you have communicated that to them and if need be pursue action through the court system. We are working diligently to provide additional coverage at each campus, however HUD funding is very tight so we may need to pursue a grant to make up for shortfalls in funding.

The staff cannot legally permit entry into your apartment without your permission. You need to plan ahead so that if you go to rehab or the hospital we will know who is permitted to go into your apartment.

Some of you have recently disposed of a vehicle or obtained a new one and are parking it in the parking lots. We require you to report new vehicles so that we can contact you in case of an emergency or if we need the vehicle moved for safety. We have had an instance where a vehicle was burning and we could not identify the owner of the vehicle parked next to it. Make sure we have your information to prevent unnecessary towing and inconvenience in retrieving a towed vehicle.

HUD subsidized housing regulations require us to make frequent inspections and preventive maintenance to insure

apartments and public areas meet or exceed standards. Please do your part to be ready when you are notified of these events. If we are scheduled to do painting or replace damaged or worn carpeting you should make arrangements to have your furniture moved. The carpet installer or painter cannot complete his work and is not responsible to move furniture.

Summer is definitely here and the very hot weather is making it imperative that you report any problems with your air conditioning as soon as the problem occurs. Most failures of the units occur during this time of year and we want to make sure that you don't have to wait to have it repaired. A number of you have medical problems and we want to make sure you do not have to spend a long time with an inoperative AC unit.

When you receive your recertification letter make sure you are communicating with Kim to provide the information requested. Most of you are not working and should be able respond in a timely manner and prevent the staff from having to follow up over and over. The new procedures we have implemented are to protect you and the staff, so please be a part of the solution by responding promptly.

IMPROVING YOUR QUALITY OF LIFE, SAFETY AND SECURITY AT LUTHER TOWERS/LUTHER VILLAGE

Most of our articles have focused on COVID-19 and the importance of using effective benchmark practices to reduce the potential of contracting and/or transmitting the virus. Let's change up for the August newsletter. I'm going to write about the many improvements planned or in progress to improve your quality of life, safety and security...pretty important stuff.

Currently, and in the weeks to come, you will notice some new faces at our Security Desks. As Mr. Coy has alluded to on several occasions, we have been pursuing 24/7 security coverage at Luther Village to replicate our coverage at Luther Towers. The purpose of expanding coverage is to place an additional shroud of protection over our residents at Luther Village. We want staff available to assist all of our residents in the event that a medical and/or fire emergency occurs. So, with that in mind, we've hired three (3) part-time employees to join our security staff, Rachel Bakley, Rob Coles, and Gabrielle Taylor, all of whom are motivated to provide a safe, secure environment for our residents. We expect that 24/7 coverage at Luther Village will be a reality in September, 2020.

Carrying on with the theme of safety, we are in the process of accepting bids for upgrading our fire protection and nurse call systems at Luther Towers; this project will bring Luther Towers on equal footing with Luther Village regarding notification systems. This may not appear exciting on the surface, but implementation will serve to improve fire, police, and medical response time by and through a more sophisticated

notification system—seconds matter and we want to provide all of you the assurance that our systems offer you the most contemporary in notification systems. Notification systems are very important; however this is but one piece of the puzzle. ***It is vitally important that you review evacuation procedures in case of fire; you cannot be cavalier about this, your life may depend on the speed and route you employ to vacate the building in the event that fire occurs in or around your living space.*** We expect to bring our recommendations for an upgraded fire protection and nurse call system before the Board of Directors in August.

You will notice construction beginning at the front entrance of Luther Towers I in the months to come. As much as the finished product will be aesthetically pleasing to the eye replete with new flooring, an attractive glass enclosure, and a contemporary sitting area, the primary objective for this project is safety. When the project is complete, residents will exit the building on the side rather than walking directly into traffic. While it is fortunate that no one has been injured thus far, this is a proactive measure to prevent any such incident going forward—promoting safety by action continues to be a top priority.

We are in the process of making preparations to re-open our cafeteria in the weeks to come. We are coordinating with the Modern Maturity Center to ensure that all measures are taken to reduce the potential of anyone contracting or transmitting COVID-19. When we do re-open, you will notice a facility which is freshly painted, new

flooring has been installed, and new furniture will be in place. All of this was done in order to improve the dining experience for those of whom deciding to enjoy a nutritious meal. Additional information will be published when a specific re-opening date is targeted. We hope you enjoy the atmosphere.

Another project initiative is to install a visitor management system within all of our apartment buildings; this is a safety and security measure. Currently, we rely on the honor system for visitors to sign a book with demographic information—this method has proven to be inconsistent and ineffective...we often cannot determine who is in our building at a snapshot in time. This becomes a security concern; there have been instances in which a resident has allowed building access to a visitor with whom they are not familiar. An automated visitor management system requires that a visitor enter demographic information into a computer (tablet) prior to requesting that a resident grant access to the building. As you know, we have 5 buildings without security staff; this initiative more effectively controls building access to visitors. Our security staff will be alerted whenever anyone enters one of the outlying buildings. Residents will continue to use their access card to gain entry to the building to which they are assigned. Not to worry, the system will be intuitive and instructions will be provided prior to implementation. We expect to make a proposal to the Board of Directors this month.

These are a few of the more prominent initiatives we are pursuing to make your

lives more pleasant at Luther Towers and Luther Village. Thanks to Mr. Coy and the staff, continuous improvement of the facilities and grounds is a foundation pillar for the success of our community. Progress is a wonderful thing and we're committed to providing all of you with a safe and enjoyable experience. Stay tuned...

We have so many new residents at Luther Towers and Luther Village! I want to welcome all of you, I know I have not had a chance to meet everyone yet. I want to share with you some programs that may help you if you are not already receiving them and also for current residents please read carefully because the income guidelines have increased this year.

The State of Delaware has a program that helps low income seniors pay for their Medicare Part B premium. You could be eligible for this program if your **income is**

below \$1435/month. There are two programs that assist with lowering prescription drug costs, Extra Help and Delaware Prescription Assistance Program. You may be eligible if your income is below these amounts:

Extra Help- \$1595/month

Delaware Prescription Assistance Program- \$2126/month.

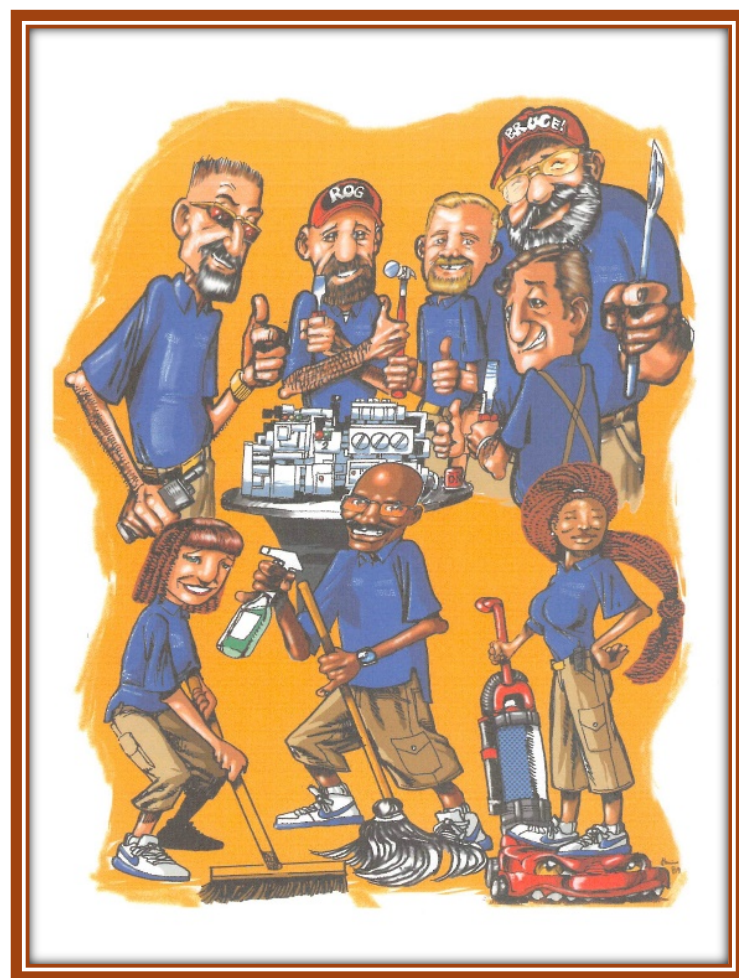
These income guidelines are significantly increased from past years. If you need assistance determining your eligibility please feel free to give me a call.

There are also programs to help with food benefits. Food Stamps (now known as SNAP) are available for seniors who have an **income of \$2000/month or less.** Food Bank of Delaware recently increased their income eligibility, if you have an income of **\$1975/month or less you are eligible.** If you are interested in applying for Food Stamps or Food Bank please give me a call. Food Bank of Delaware is a free box of food that is delivered to Luther Towers and Luther Village campus one time a month.

We are now scheduling transportation for medical appts, if you have an appt coming up make sure you call and schedule a ride. Bluebird transportation has resumed and things are going well. Please make sure to call Luther Village 1 Security desk to reserve a seat on the Bluebird. It is now a requirement to RSVP for the Bluebird. You can make your reservation at 674-3780 ext 212.

Please be patient as we attempt to get all activities up and running- we are making great progress!

After a while I had to visit the little guy's room. But no one would take me. So, I started out on my own, unnoticed. When the show was over and the head count was done, they discovered I was gone. A search party was formed. "Nuns, Two priests, some circus performers, and a million screaming kids (not a million, but it probably seemed like it to a lot of the adults.

All of a sudden there was a scream, and "Oh my God!!" I guess I had been found. There I sat smiling saying "Nice kitty". Yup, I'd somehow got myself into the lion's cage. On each side of me sat a female lion, in front two full grown lions and pacing were two female tigers. The lion tamer came and loaded his gun with real ammunition. He started into the cage telling me "PK son, don't move, you'll be fine". He grabbed the whip. He couldn't get the cats out of the main cage into their standby cages because I and the cats were sitting right at the entrance/exit. He had one hell of a time getting to me because the cats around me wouldn't let him near me. The newspaper folks were there taking pictures and the flashes from the cameras upset the cats. After an hour or so, they finally let him through (after he fired two shots in the air). "What a day!"

When I got back to the orphanage and everyone was settled down, the nun made my bare backside look as red as the meat the cats would have for supper. Then she got on her knees and thanked God for watching over me.

I guess my Mr. Stupid life started early in life.

Easy Peach Crisp

Ingredients:

1 pouch (1 lb. 1.5 oz) Betty Crocker oatmeal cookie mix
½ cup cold butter
5 cups frozen sliced peaches, thawed/drained, or 1 can (29 oz) sliced peaches, drained.

Directions:

1. Heat oven 375 degrees. In large bowl, place cookie mix. Cut in butter, using pastry blender or fork until mixture looks like coarse crumbs.
2. In ungreased 8-inch square baking dish or 1-quart round casserole, place peaches. Sprinkle cookie mixture over peaches.
3. Bake 25 to 30 minutes or until topping is golden brown. Serve warm or cool.

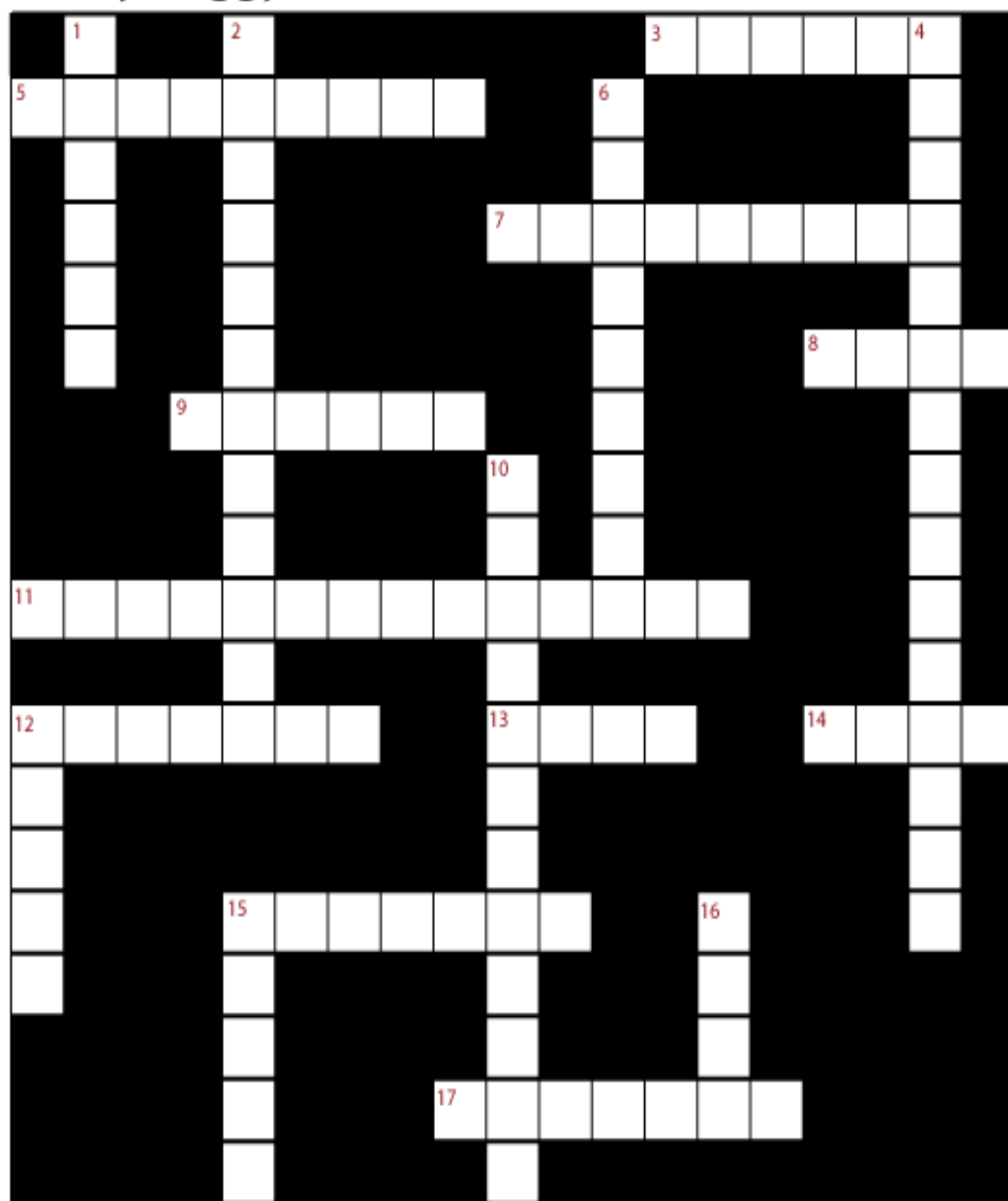
