
From the Desk of The Deputy Director JESSICA PARSONS

MAINTENANCE NEWS

Kelly's Reminders:

I've noticed that when residents are using the washing machines, they are either overloading them or putting too much detergent in the compartment; both will cause the machine to go "out-of-order"!

When loading clothes into the machine, do NOT overfill the drum.



Lots of Clothes + Water = Very Heavy Load and will cause the machine to go "out-of-order"

When putting clothes into the machine, only fill halfway up the interior of the drum. If you're loading towels, fill even less, about ¹/₃ up the drum. Towels are much heavier than clothes and could cause the machine to "walk" and go "out-of-order"!

Lots of Detergent = Lots of Suds

and will cause the machine to go "out-of-order"

Only use ¹/₈-cup to ¹/₄-cup liquid detergent. It will just cover the detergent compartment in the dispenser drawer. Filling it even further equals too much suds and will cause the machine to go "out-of-order"!





WEIRD CLEANING SPOTS

Does this look familiar? Granted, it's taken out of context but, when in full view, it's still unnoticed! These are the overflow holes in my bathroom sink! They also serve to allow air in, which helps water flow down the drain. Now that you know where they are, have you ever wondered about what lurks inside? Stick a Q-Tip in and swirl a bit. Be prepared to say, "Gross!!!" It's a wonderful place for MOLD to grow and thrive.

Do you have a spray bottle of bleach? No?! Oh, we'll have to cover "spray bottles" soon!

<u>Here's what to do</u>: If you have the spray bottle of bleach, squirt the holes <u>being very careful</u> not to spray yourself and your clothing or your bathroom mats!! Yikes! Leave it alone for a bit to let the bleach do its thing. Then, here's the gross part, put some bleach on a disposable rag or wad of paper towels and "corkscrew" an end into the hole twirling it in as far as you can go. Repeat until the holes are clean.


From The Desk Supervisor – KARI EBERT
