From the Desk of The Executive Director KIM MENDOZA

April is upon us, I just can't believe how fast time is going by. According to the calendar Spring is here and we should be seeing better weather, the trees and flowers blooming and I am sure a bunch of mallards hanging around. You know it is that time of the year – time for new life. Take some time and go outside and enjoy the wonders nature has provided. Also, in the month of April is Easter, a time when Christians celebrate the resurrection of Jesus, little kids enjoy their Easter baskets and dyeing and hunting eggs. One of my favorite holidays.

I saw a comment in our Daily Log Sheets kept by the Security Desk over the weekend of a DART bus speeding in front of the building (twice), there was also another entry a week or so back on a dark rainy night that a resident almost got hit by a car exiting the parking lot.

Two things you need to consider...

First, if you are a pedestrian, please be aware of your surroundings. Just because **you see** a car approaching **does not mean they see you**.

Secondly, if you are driving, be EXTRA cautious when you are in parking lots, backing up or driving. No one wants to be responsible for hurting someone, or worse...

There has been a tremendous increase in the number of complaints the Security desk has been receiving about individuals smoking in their apartments. The apartments on both campuses are non-smoking, that means cigarettes or marijuana. Individuals doing this will find themselves facing a lease termination.

I particularly want to stress the fact that this is federally subsidized housing and, under <u>federal</u> law, marijuana is still considered a **schedule 1 narcotic...** which makes it illegal for you to have on this property.

INFORMATION BOTH CAMPUSES

RENT will be pulled on **April 4th.**

In some months, your rent may not come out of your account on the 4th due to holidays or weekends.

Please check with your bank to verify rent funds have been deducted *before* pulling your money out while assuming the rent was already paid.

This will save you from Insufficient Funds problems.

REMINDER: We have individuals asking this question frequently – so I thought I would address it here.

When you have an overnight visitor, they are only allowed to stay overnight for 14 days in a 6-month period. This is both 14 days in a row *or* 14 cumulative days in a 6-month period.

If you have a question as to whether your guest has reached the limit, please contact the security desk as they keep track of it.

Typically, the security desk will notify you when your guest has reached the limit and let you know when they are able to stay again.



From the Desk of The Deputy Director JESSICA PARSONS

Garden Boxes: We are in the process of relocating and renumbering the garden boxes which will then be filled with new dirt. This project should be done by April 10, 2023.

The number you were assigned in the past will **NOT** be automatically assigned to you again. That number is likely in a different location; therefore, I would suggest that you view the location of the box before submitting your request.

Luther Village garden boxes are ready to be assigned. Requests are first come first serve.

Rent: Rent is pulled by EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer) on the 4th of each month. If the 4th falls on a holiday or a weekend, it is pulled on the next business day.

This process puts your mind at ease that rent is taken care of in the event of hospitalization, out of town, etc.

Your lease states that after 3 NSFs (non-sufficient funds), your lease could be terminated.

If you want to validate that your rent is paid, calling your bank is the best option.

Accounting will not be able to confirm if your rent is paid until days after it was pulled.
