We would like to welcome and thank Faye Fulton (Site Manager) and Shirley Williams (kitchen helper) for making the Grand Opening seamless. These ladies are a joy to be around and are a perfect addition to the Luther Village campus. Please welcome them and stop in and say hello.

I want to clarify a few items regarding the Luther Village III kitchen:

- Lunch is served Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays from 11:00am-1:00pm
- Donation is \$2.00
- If you are interested in purchasing an additional meal, you may visit the kitchen at 12:45pm to see if they have extra food
- If you would like to pre-pay meals, you may do so. The volunteer will fill out a card to keep on file.
- Please try and pay with exact change. No bills greater than a \$10 bill unless you are pre-paying.
- Beginning July 1st, sign-ups for eat-in and grab-n-go will be located on a board next to the entrance of Luther Village III activity room. If you plan to eat, please sign up as soon as possible. The count for meals needs to be called in 2 days in advance. We don't want you to miss out!

I want to thank Jack (LT), Mary (LT), Elaine (LV) and Cheryl (LV) who have dedicated time to volunteer in each kitchen. We couldn't do this without you!

As you all know, with rising costs of about <u>**EVERYTHING**</u>, it doesn't stop with utilities. I have observed in the most recent inspections, that many residents left lights and TVs on

when not home and windows open with the air conditioning unit running. We are required to provide utilities based on your lease but also your lease states that you are not to **waste** utilities provided by the landlord. Please make yourself aware of these items when you leave your unit.

We ask that residents inform staff when there is a situation that needs to be addressed with fellow residents, aides or visitors. For example, parking issues, laundry, and noise complaints to name a few. We ask you not to take matters into your own hands and allow staff to handle the not so pleasant situations.

- Declaration of Independence Date: On July 4, 1776, the newly independent United States had a population of only 2.5 million. It was on this day that the Declaration of Independence was adopted, signed by 56 men representing the 13 colonies. In October of 2023, a notice for a Laundry Increase was distributed to All Residents. The price had been \$1.50 for a long time but the costs of everything has been skyrocketing – as everyone is well aware.

Luther Towers / Village has suffered increases on a scale we cannot imagine... electricity alone went up 40%!

Therefore, as of January 1st, the cost increased to \$2.00 per load to wash and to \$2.00 per load to dry.

Now, as we were informed, the cost is increasing:

### July 1st \$2.50 per load to <u>wash</u> & \$2.50 per load to <u>dry</u>

Please remember that LT/LV is far less expensive than public laundry facilities. Not to mention the amenities you enjoy everyday!
