and to use the proper entrance / exits to the building to take out recyclables and larger items. I understand this may cause a slight inconvenience, but it ensures that our buildings stay locked and secured. Thanks for your understanding.

Holidays are quickly approaching – and with that comes the hustle and bustle of the season, but it is <u>so</u> nice to spend quality time with family and friends.

If you know someone who might be alone this holiday season, reach out and invite them over or plan a meal together. You never know the situation your neighbor may be in and the gesture could mean the world to them.

FIRE ALARMS: We've had two recent instances where the fire alarms went off at each of our campuses. Thankfully, both times were not actual fires. Many times this happens after business hours when security personnel are the only ones on duty and at times Luther Village may not be staffed.

When emergencies arise, security has to prioritize the tasks at hand and attend to the emergency as well as ensure residents are safe. This is where your cooperation is imperative.

When the fire alarm sounds, you are to exit immediately and report to the <u>DESIGNATED ASSEMBLY AREA</u> where you will be counted as <u>SAFE</u>!

If you are <u>unable to go down the stairs</u>, the safe haven is the <u>stairwell</u> on your floor. You will wait there until help arrives.

If you are unable to <u>exit your apartment</u>, please know that <u>help will come to you</u>.

INFORMATION BOTH CAMPUSES RENT will be pulled on <u>November 4th</u>.

In some months, your rent may not come out of your account on the 4th **due to holidays** or weekends.

Please check with your bank to verify rent funds have been deducted *before* pulling your money out while assuming the rent was already paid. This will avoid Insufficient Funds problems. Too many times, when alarms are triggered, we find that residents go sit in their car, hang out at the gazebo or on a bench outside.

<u>These are NOT Acceptable Locations</u> <u>for Anyone to Report.</u>

If it were a true fire, we need to be able to **<u>account for everyone</u>** and we can't do that if you are not in your designated area.

As a reminder, when exiting the stairwell, please make sure to walk down ONE side of the stairs so that the entire path is not blocked. This will prevent individuals from being trampled on and allows others to pass easily. Periodically, we conduct fire drills – please treat these as a true emergency and respond accordingly. From The Desk Supervisor - KARI EBERT

Happy November to you all! As I've said before, November is my daughter's favorite month because it's her birthday. Even though she'll be 35, we still celebrate it all month long, and she's always claimed Thanksgiving as her own personal holiday. So, our family is always geared up for November several months before hand.

Speaking of Thanksgiving, I'm thankful when I think of the feeling of belonging that comes from being a part of a community like Luther Towers/Luther Village. Coretta Scott King, wife of the late Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr, said, "The greatness of a community is most accurately measured by the compassionate actions of its members."

One of the quickest ways to separate the community and make individuals feel disconnected is **gossip**. As we slide into the holiday season, there is less and less sunlight, more and more isolation, and frazzled nerves. This adds to pent up frustrations that are just looking for a place to land. We should be on our guard and think before we pass on ugly stories we've heard (or assumed) about another.

Showing compassion to others who may be going through a difficult season is one way to realign a feeling of connection. We should also have compassion on ourselves when we feel like saying ugly things about our neighbor. Stop, breathe, and investigate why you want to pass on the ugliness. What part inside yourself needs compassion? Encouraging yourself to release those negative emotions in a healthy way (write it out, take a walk, move to music, cuss into your pillow) can shake away the urge to gossip.

Let's help keep our community welcoming and compassionate.

Here's a story about how hard it is to reverse ugly gossip once it's released.

An old proverb relates the story of a person who repeated gossip – some rumor about a neighbor. Soon, the whole community had heard the rumor. Later, the person who spread the gossip learned that the rumor was untrue. The person was very sorry and went to an elder in the community – who had a reputation for great wisdom – to seek advice. The elder told the person, "Go to your home and take a feather pillow outside. Rip it open and scatter the feathers, then return to me tomorrow."

The person did as the elder had instructed. The next day, the person visited the elder. The elder said, "Go and collect the feathers you scattered yesterday and bring them back to me." The person went home and searched for the feathers, but the wind had carried them all away.

The person returned to the elder and said, "I could find none of the feathers I scattered yesterday."

"You see," said the elder, "it's easy to scatter the feathers but impossible to get them back." So it is with gossip...

The Moral of The Story:

It doesn't take much to spread hurtful words, but once you do, you can never completely undo the damage.
