Other recent renovations – the roof on Luther Towers III has been replaced. It was original to the building.



Bathroom renovations have started using the \$850,000 in appropriations monies we were rewarded. This will allow us to convert approximately 65 bathrooms (total).

Kimberly R. Dobraski passed away on Sunday, January 5, 2025, at her residence in Dover, DE. She was born in Dover on October 1, 1972.

Kimberly graduated from Woodbridge High School in Bridgeville, DE, in 1991 and later attended Norwich University in Burlington, VT.

Kimberly's passion for animals was evident throughout her life and she worked in various roles caring for them. Garden Boxes:

Spring in is in the air! If you would like to reserve a garden box this year, please see Corrin Parsons. The boxes are assigned by number for Luther Towers and Luther Village. If you had a box last year and want to keep the same one, please let Corrin know. We do not automatically carry your name over to the new season.

Luther Towers IV HUD Inspection:

Maintenance is gearing up for our next HUD inspection on March 12, 2025, in LT-IV. As a reminder, please make sure you have clear pathways, pull-cords should be hanging to the floor and not blocked or taped to the wall, remove excess clutter, etc. We appreciate your patience and cooperation during this time.

Changes to Family Income or Composition:

To ensure that assisted tenants pay rents in accordance with HUD requirements, tenants must supply information requested by the owner or HUD for use in an interim recertification of family income and composition. All tenants must notify the owner when:

1. A family member moves out of the unit;
2. The family proposes to move a new member into the unit (after screening & approval);
3. An adult member of the family who was reported as unemployed on the most recent certification or recertification obtains employment;
4. The family's income cumulatively increases by \$200 or more per month.

We have had some instances where a resident obtained employment and didn't report the income in a timely manner. When this occurs, there is a repayment amount that is owed on behalf of the tenant. This means you received more subsidy than you were allowed; therefore, you will have to pay a monthly payment in addition to the rent amount until it is paid in full. Please make sure you are reporting any changes that could affect your rent. If you are unsure, please don't hesitate to ask.

Recertifications:

When it is time for your recertification, you are notified with an appointment day and time. Please make every effort to attend your recertification appointment. We know things can happen or come up, so if you need to reschedule, please contact

Corrin at 302-674-1408 ext. 113

as soon as possible. These appointments are done in a timely manner to ensure we are in compliance with HUD guidelines.

Documents that we need for your appointment are as follows:

- Social Security award letter (not year-end tax document)
- Information on any other source of income
- 4 to 6 most recent paystubs if you are employed
- Value of assets; bank accounts, home value, life insurance, bonds, stocks, IRA, etc.
- Expenses: medical, dental, vision, doctor visits, over the counter meds (must have a doctor's note)

As always, if you have any questions, please don't hesitate to ask.

Conservation of Energy:

Conserving energy is essential for several reasons but I would like to address the reduction of electricity expense. The subsidized rent you pay includes your utility expense. The electricity expense is one of the biggest items we have to budget for annually. The chart below shows the expense per building (from 2023 and 2024) and if you were to apply the expense to the number of units, it shows what it would cost per unit annually. There was a reduction in the expense from 2023 to 2024. Huge kudos to you in aiding in the reduction of energy consumption. Additionally, installing energy efficient appliances, LED lighting, new windows, new roof, etc., all helped to reduce consumption. See the chart on next page.

As you can see, on average there is a monthly electricity expense between \$72.35-\$107.74 per unit. Of course, this includes electricity utilized in common areas, etc. But this gives you an idea if it's broken down by the number of units. I want to impress upon you that it is important to conserve energy as much as you can. Here are some ways to help conserve energy:

- Adjust your thermostat up or down when you are not occupying your unit
- If you are gone for vacation, overnight visits, hospital stays, etc.
- Report any seals that may be worn or broken on your windows/doors
- Turn off lights when not in use
- Unplug devices when not being used
- Use LED light bulbs
- Wash clothes in cold water
- Limit use of hot water
- Taking shorter showers decreases the amount of hot water consumed
- Do not run your heater/air unit while your windows are open
- Take advantage of nice days and turn off your heater/air unit and open windows

Conservation of Energy Contest:

The building showing the biggest reduction of electricity expense for 2025 will be awarded a free lunch on us. We will do one building per campus. We only have 4 months remaining (March-June) in the 2025 fiscal year. We will know the final numbers in October once our audit is complete. I look forward to seeing who the winners will be!

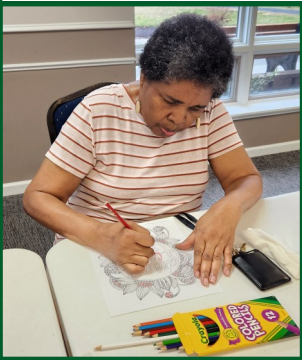
RENT pulled on March 4th.

KELLY'S REMINDERS:

I have noticed that when residents are using the washing machines, they are putting soap powder in the laundry tray or putting the pods in the tray. No! No! No! ONLY LIQUIDS

- ◆ Only Liquid laundry soap, softener and bleach can go in the Laundry Tray!
- ◆ When using the Pods, they go first directly into the machine followed by the clothes!
- ◆ From 1/8 to 1/4 cup Liquid Laundry Soap is necessary per load – NO More!
 If you use more than this, lots of suds is created and the machine will go out of order!
- ◆ If you overload the washer with clothes, it will throw the washer off balance and the machine will go out of order!



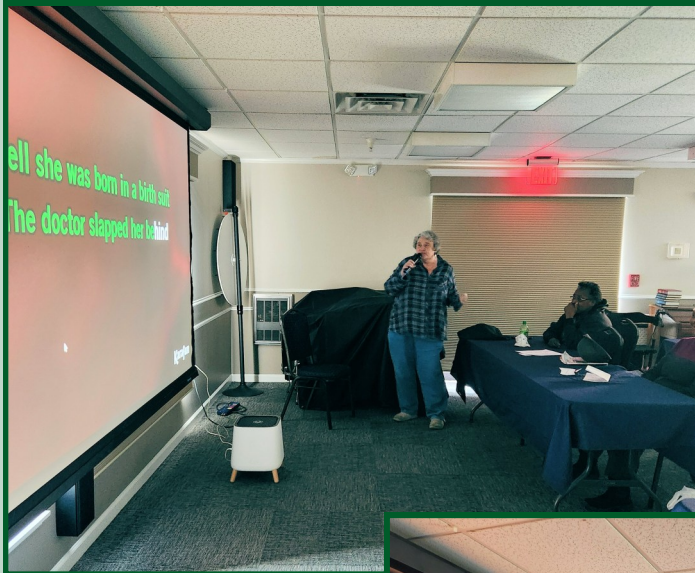
