From the Desk of The Deputy Director

Well, we are now in full swing of the spring season and the temperature seems to be leveling out.

I discovered something about Spring that I never knew, and I thought I'd share it with you. Did you know, according to NOAA's National Centers for Environmental Information, the spring season breaks down in two ways. They are Meteorological Spring and Astronomical Spring.

Astronomical seasons are based on the position of Earth in relation to the sun, whereas the meteorological seasons are based on the annual temperature cycle. It takes 365.24 days for Earth to travel around the sun, creating the need for an additional day each fourth year. This is where the term "leap year" comes from.

Meteorological seasons are based on the annual temperature cycle along with the calendar, designating Spring as a transition season from hot to cold or cold to hot seasons. These months include March, April and May.

Now that we have reached Spring, the temperatures are warming up. I have seen an increased number of residents enjoying the exterior pleasantries of the Luther Towers/ Luther Village properties.

For example, beautiful flowers and vegetables are growing in their planters, compliments of the dedicated gardeners. The birds are chirping and dancing with the wind. The walkways are clean and clear of debris. The sun is gleaming off the lake, and you can enjoy these views while walking on the trail or sitting in the gazebo. What amazingly beautiful sights.

I want to take the time to let you know how much I, personally, appreciate all the effort residents with pets, as well as those without, have put into maintaining the aesthetics of Luther Towers and Luther Village. A Tribute to My Father (February 18, 1938 – April 20, 2026)

June is here which means we're about to be halfway through 2026! I don't know how time speeds by so quickly. Do you? It's been a blur for me. Many of you know I was gone for several weeks. I went to take care of my Dad who was suffering from final stage heart failure. It was a blessing to be able to spend his last weeks with him before he went home to be with the Lord and to be reunited with the love of his life, my beautiful Mom.

It was also heartbreakingly hard. I don't know if you know, but humans are very stubborn! Especially 88-year old fathers of German/Irish heritage named Bill Ebert! No matter how weak he became, he refused any help offered. He figured out how to use his rollator to carry his coffee to the kitchen table, even if it spilled all over the top of it and he lost ¼ of its contents. Well, I am also a human of German/Irish heritage with his own very stubborn DNA, so I stopped offering and just got him coffee before he could get up from his chair. Our birthdays are one day and 30 years apart. So, we shared a similar stubbornness and sometimes butted heads (a lot of times actually).

Many times he out-stubborn-ed me though because I just couldn't take away his dignity and pride as he lost the ability to do things he found easy in his youth. It made me realize that it's true what they say about quality of life. It's not about how long you live, it's about how you live. In his last week, we went to his great grand-daughter's second birthday, ate hamburgers at his grandson's very first house, and hosted several visits from his daughters and other grandkids.

He supervised my kids and me as we mulched his flower beds (I came home with poison ivy!), then supervised my sister as we planted flowers in the boxes he hand-built for my mother before she passed. On his very last full day on earth, we went to church where he took communion and ate meatloaf, potatoes, and corn that my other sister made. He ended the day doing Sudoku puzzles and watching Jeopardy (which neither of us won). It was all his favorites in one day.

Because his heart was only working below 14%, every single one of those activities most likely took a little bit of time from his life, but he is not the kind of man who just sits there waiting for each minute to pass. He sat down with me several times during my time with him and said, "Don't feel sorry for me. I had a beautiful, amazing life and I have 23 blessings (4 daughters, 8 grandkids, and 11 great grandkids) who came from your mother and me. I know where I'm going and I know who's waiting for me." That's all anyone could ask for.

Thank you all for your condolences and prayers. I'm very blessed to be able to work here and pray that I can be a blessing to all of you.



Gentle Reminders:

THE GIFT

To pull the metal splinter from my palm
my father recited a story in a low voice.
I watched his lovely face and not the blade.
Before the story ended, he'd removed

but hear his voice still, a well
of dark water, a prayer.
And I recall his hands,
two measures of tenderness
he laid against my face,
the flames of discipline
he raised above my head.

Had you entered that afternoon,
you would have thought you saw a man
planting something in a boy's palm,
a silver tear, a tiny flame.

Had you followed that boy
you would have arrived here,
where I bend over my wife's right hand.
Look how I shave her thumbnail down
so carefully she feels no pain.

Watch as I lift the splinter out.
I was seven when my father
took my hand like this,
and I did not hold that shard
between my fingers and think,
Metal that will bury me,
christen it Little Assassin,
Ore Going Deep for My Heart.

And I did not lift up my wound and cry,
Death visited here!
I did what a child does
when he's given something to keep.
I kissed my father.

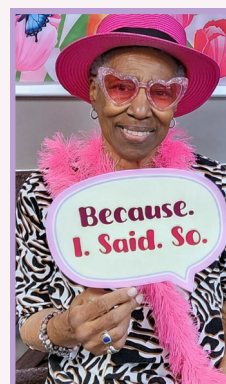

How To Read A Book Review A Review by Jack Ostram

When you select a book to read you hope the book will hold your interest until the end and not disappoint. “**How To Read A Book**” by Monica Wood is just such a novel.

The novel interweaves the lives of three people: Violet, a 22-year-old incarcerated for vehicular manslaughter; Harriet, a retired schoolteacher and widow; and Frank, a widower and handyman. Their lives are interconnected since Harriet volunteers to run a book club in the prison where Violet is a prisoner and accidentally killed Frank’s wife in an accident over two years earlier.

All three are estranged from their biological families in one way or another. Violet’s family wants nothing to do with her at all and her sister simply leaves her in Portland, ME. Harriet’s niece Sophie is leaving for graduate school on the West Coast. Frank’s daughter Kristy is married and has moved away. She blames Violet for her mother’s death and resents her father for his sympathy for Violet.

When Violet – released early – goes into a bookstore to buy a stray cat, she meets Harriet there searching for literature for the prison book club. Frank, who is a

handyman and has been speaking with Harriet each time she comes into the store, recognizes Violet and things really begin to get interesting.

This is a book about family but not in the traditional sense. It is a melding of personalities, experiences, remorse, forgiveness, and ultimately love. It’s about three people brought together by circumstances and finding empathy and a love for each other.

Ms. Wood’s triple perspective approach is not confusing since each time there is a character shift it seems very natural. All the characters are well thought-rounded including the secondary ones. Her research on parrots (oh, did I forget to mention parrots?) is precise and each parrot’s personality is as unique as the humans. My favorite is Ollie.

This is a novel that will keep your interest – not for suspense but because of the characters – human and otherwise. It will give you an understanding of the true meaning of family and that it does not have to be biological. It is well worth the time spent reading.

Besides you might learn something about parrots you didn’t know. Wink, wink.

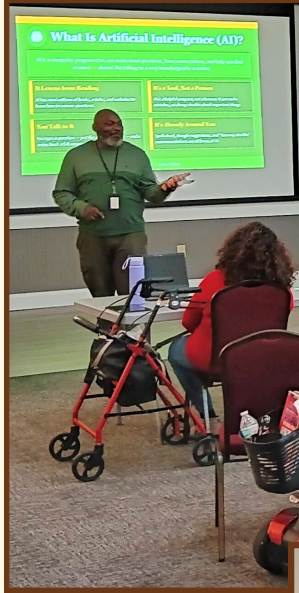

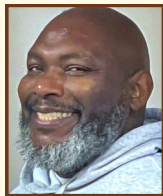
